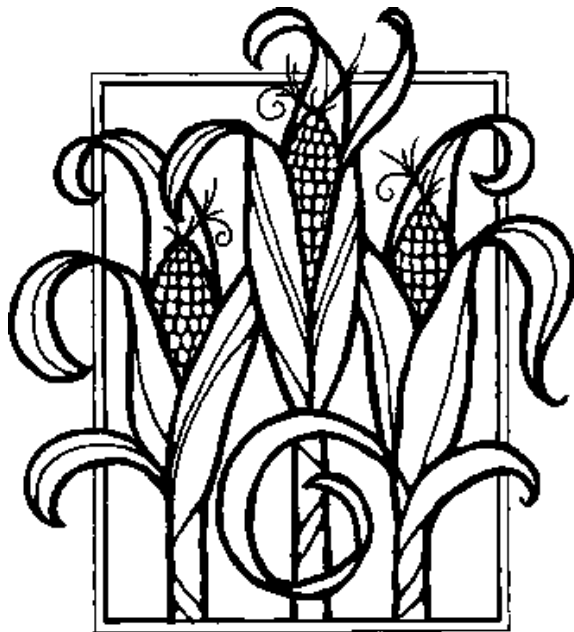

Make a Joyful Noise!

During the week the church is normally very quiet during the day. Occasionally the fax machine spits out some enticement for a splendid vacation to the Holy Land or an offer to receive a trial bundle of ecclesiastical cleaning rags. Even better is when the phone rings and an insistent voice states they must speak to the pastor on some matter to which only an ordained person could possibly respond with any understanding. (Usually a brand new discovery of where Noah's Ark is, and how we can get exclusive documentary proof – in order to definitively prove the complete inerrancy of Holy Writ, and thus save our precarious Lutheran souls -- of its location for an annual fee of \$582.99) You might laugh – it happens! Beyond that and the occasional, very welcome visitor, it's quiet.

However, once a year, for one full week, the silence is broken. Actually a better word is "shattered." It's glorious, it's cacophonous, it calls to mind the sounds of the heavenly chorus of angels and archangels, cherubim and seraphim trying to learn some devilishly difficult thirty part celestial hymn of...praise? It's innocuously entitled **VACATION** Bible School. My question has always been: "Whose vacation?" Certainly not the dedicated shepherds who can be seen and heard guiding the energetic little sheep dressed in chefs' hats (I'm talking about the sheep here, not the shepherds who are wearing aprons), sun baking clay pepperoni, sausage, and pepper pizzas, watching popcorn kernels dancing in glasses of vinegar and baking soda, running back and forth across the North Wing great hall with empty soda bottles clasped tightly in tongs, or cheering and dancing in the sanctuary to some words about God's recipe for us.

It all makes for a very joyful noise. The noise is that of our children learning about how God has a plan for them and all of us, and how that plan can be found in the Bible. Yet VBS goes beyond even that. Children learn that there are those people in their lives who want to help them have fun, help them learn, allow them to be part of God's loving plan. This week the church is not only filled with children learning and playing, but also with many volunteers who are giving of their valuable time to be shown how they are part of God's recipe for the ministry of His Word here at Saint Nicholas.

THE CORE PLANNING GROUP

It has been almost a year since the Core Planning Group began the journey to help strengthen ministries, leaders and volunteers at Saint Nicholas. It seems appropriate to give a summary of the year's activities and accomplishments.

The year started with the group focusing on welcoming visitors and the worship experience at Saint Nicholas. Some of you participated in the worship and welcome survey. The results of this survey will help our newly called pastor better understand who we are and who we want to be. Some of your ideas have already been implemented, such as name tags and a unified worship service on the fifth Sunday of the month. The CPG is looking forward to sharing your thoughts and ideas with our new pastor.

Currently the CPG is working with Vicki Williams, our Christian Education Director. In partnership with Vicki, we are restructuring the leadership roles within the Christian Education ministries. Leader positions have been created and teams are being developed. Ask God where you can lead within Christian Education and then listen for the answer. Soon Vicki and the CPG will be calling people into the ministries of Christian Education. Because you are a member of Saint Nicholas, Vicki and the CPG value what you have to offer.

The CPG isn't like the typical committee; the group is dynamic in that it is always changing. The group's objective is to help current leaders, develop new leaders and strengthen volunteers in all ministry areas at Saint Nicholas. People who have a passion for worship and hospitality participated in the earlier discussions. Now that the CPG is discussing Christian Education, we have people who have a passion for programs such as Sunday school, Vacation Bible School and confirmation. The time commitment to participate in the group depends on the person's interest in the current agenda or topic. The CPG meets about every six weeks, sometimes more and sometimes less, depending on the agenda. THE SPIRIT OF MINISTERING

To me, September is like another New Year. It's a fresh, new start with the start of the school year. The Chancel Choir begins singing again during worship and Sunday School begins. It's a great time to look at your schedule to see if new beginnings in ministry are part of your fresh start.

In Discovering God's Vision for Your Life, Kenneth Haugk says, "The volunteer workforce in the world contributes significantly to the betterment of society... But is *volunteerism* the right word to use to describe what happens in the church? Decidedly not... In a biblical theology of ministry and calling, there are no "volunteers." All are ministers. This difference is significant. When we Christians believe in our hearts that we are truly ministering, it changes the way we regard ourselves. It also changes the way we think about those we serve and those who serve us."

I especially liked the reminder that Ministry is service, and that we are all ministers or servants. He also points out that "there are no insignificant ministries in the church. Some are visible and some are behind the scenes, but all are valuable."

You can also go on line at www.saintnicholaslutheran.org. Look at the section labeled "Volunteer Opportunities" and click on "Worship Services Volunteer Calendar." Click on the date, and which of the three worship services for which you want information. The screen that comes up will give you the entire list of those who are serving on that date. If there are openings where volunteers are still needed, you can follow the instructions on that page, which sends an email to Barbara Harris. You can also sign up for a reminder notice.

How do I know what I signed up for? You can also use the same website and locations to see what you volunteered for by clicking on the date and service, and seeing if you are listed.

In addition, the newsletter has the calendar for the entire month – you can pull it out, highlight your assignment, and put it on your fridge or bulletin board. The *Weekly* insert in the church bulletin has a listing of who is helping at worship the following week. And finally, check the church bulletin when you get to church to see if your name is listed for that day's service!

WHY DO WE NEED SUNDAY SCHOOL?

One of the hardest things for a parent to do is to let go of their child's hand; to allow them to walk on their own. We're thrilled when they take those first steps, but carefully watch over them to try to catch them when they fall. As they grow, they walk farther and farther away, and it's much harder to watch over them, let alone catch them when they fall.

But, God always watches over them and can be there to keep them from falling. As kids learn the stories of the Bible, they learn that God loves them, forgives them and is always with them. That's a powerful tool to guide our children and to cushion, or even prevent, their fall. Psalm 78:4 says "We will tell the coming generation the glorious deeds of the Lord, and His might and the wonders that He has done." Verse 7 continues, "So that they should set their hope in God, and not forget the works of God, but keep His commandments." As kids walk through a minefield of temptations and peer pressure, we can only hope that we've taught them to choose the right path. His word can light that pathway.

I always feel strengthened reading His word, hearing the sermon and singing His praise. Our teachers work hard to give our children, young and old, that same feeling of strength so that they may walk in His ways. Knowing that my children have been given the opportunity to go to Sunday School gives me the faith I need to let go of their hands.

- The council had a brief question/answer session with a pastoral candidate recommended by the Call Committee. Information will be shared with the congregation at the August 28 congregational meeting.
